

# 2018 Wall Street Exchange – Another Successful Program

The 2018 Wall Street Exchange (“WSE”) Program was a major success. This year’s program, which extended from June 13<sup>th</sup> through August 2<sup>nd</sup>, was hosted by BMO, BNP Paribas, BNY Mellon, MUFG, New York Life, SMBC, and Wells Fargo. A total of 34 applicants were accepted into the program this year. Program participants hailed from 25 colleges and universities, including Baruch College, Bucknell University, NYU, Lehman College, Howard University, Cornell University, Columbia University to name a few, and held internship positions at major institutions including FWA President Circle Firms MUFG, BNP Paribas, Wells Fargo. Other internship employers included Barclays, Goldman Sachs, BlackRock, Bank of America, JP Morgan Chase, and MTA New York City.

This year’s weekly WSE Program sessions included (i) career panel discussions on various topics including emotional intelligence for workplace success and tips on turning an internship into a full time offer,(ii) keynote addresses on various topics including increasing one’s impact to be seen and move up, and best practices for creating a powerful marketing plan and resume and (iii) workshops on resume writing, mock interviews and trading desk activities.
